KICK OFF MEETING

COATNET was re-launched last November 28th with a kick-off event attended by 25 affiliates. The members of the new Steering Committee were elected, and the event discussed the 2023 work plan and intervention areas to strengthen joint advocacy efforts against human trafficking. The handover of the Network coordination from Caritas Internationalis to the Steering Committee has ended, making the latter an active governing body.

Specific Objectives of COATNET

The Specific Objectives of COATNET affiliates for 2022-2024 are to strengthen ecumenical cooperation in advocacy actions against human trafficking and increase the accompaniment of survivors in regaining their lives.

Expected Results of COATNET

The main potential expected results for COATNET in the period 2022-2024 are to become a Network of active and engaged members, to make the general public better informed about human trafficking and the work of COATNET, and to collect data on human trafficking trends and affiliates' activities to contribute to each organization's advocacy actions.

52ND SESSION OF THE HUMAN RIGHTS COUNCIL, 27TH MAR. 2023

On March 27th, COATNET collaborated in organising the side-event, 'Human Trafficking in Armed Conflict and Post-Conflict Situations', in conjunction with the 52nd session of the HRC (in Geneva). Speakers included: Geneviève Colas, Secours Catholique - Caritas France and COATNET (moderator); Michel Veuthey, Ambassador of the Sovereign Order of Malta to monitor and combat trafficking in persons; Virginia Gamba de Potgieter, Special Representative of the Secretary-General for Children and Armed Conflict; Natalia Holynska, Manager of counter-trafficking projects, Caritas Ukraine and COATNET; Codruta Fernea, president of Catholic Action Romania; Hessen Sayah, Head of Protection Department, Caritas Lebanon and COATNET; Mikiko Otani, Chair, United Nations Committee on the Rights of the Child. WITNESS FROM UKRAINE - Oleksandr, a 46-year-old resident of Kyiv, has a large family to support, including his sick wife and elderly mother. Despite looking for legal employment for nearly five years, he could not find a job covering his family's needs. After a projectile hit his house during the war, Oleksandr and his wife sought Caritas's help installing new windows. They were referred to the Caritas Anti-Trafficking Counseling Center. After taking up a job that didn't pay well and then suffering labour exploitation, Caritas helped Oleksandr and is currently employed as a driver in a Kyiv city hospital. With the help of coursework, his wife is learning to sew and is set to start her own business or other income sources. Oleksandr's family is overcoming the negative impacts of war, joblessness, poverty, and lack of care and attention from their father with the support received. "I Came Back to Life Again!" Oleksandr told Caritas Ukraine workers.

BREAKING THE CHAINS: COATNET AGAINST LABOUR EXPLOITATION

On 29 May 2023, on the occasion of the Trócaire Safeguard Week, COATNET was invited to speak about the report published last 1 May entitled BREAKING THE CHAINS, which aims to provide a global picture of the crime of trafficking from the perspective of labour exploitation.
